While we officially partner with GCU, we have also supported employees in their education through St. Francis University, University of Phoenix, and the American College of Education.


WCSEA Overview

WCSEA is a special education cooperative serving 8 school districts in Woodford County. We provide specialized opportunities for students ages 3–22, specifically early childhood programs, a behavioral/emotional development day school, life skills/skill builder classes, and a transition program. Our classrooms are led by a teacher and at least one paraprofessional, along with therapists in different disciplines such as speech therapy, occupational therapy and physical therapy. WCSEA has approximately 100 employees providing services and programs for students throughout the county.

The benefits of working for WCSEA as a paraprofessional are:

- Work full time and receive health insurance benefits if desired
- Receive up to 9 credit hours of tuition reimbursement each year
- Have the opportunity to work along great teachers while obtaining your degree
- Do your student teaching in the same classroom that you are working as a paraprofessional while continuing to be paid full time
